

Sample Garbage Management Plan

Vessels capable of carrying 15 persons or more, or that weigh more than 400 gross tons must develop and carry a **Garbage Management Plan** and be fitted with the necessary equipment outlined in the plan.

What follows on the next two pages is:

- A sample of a completed Garbage Management Plan to give you an idea of how to construct your own
- A blank Plan for you to complete.

Once completed, you will need to store a copy of this form on your vessel and produce it on request.

1. Collecting Garbage

Waste will not be discharged overboard.

Bins will be placed on vessel for recyclable items and for general waste.

Each bin will be clearly labelled and will be lined with bin liners for ease of disposal and to ensure that liquids are contained.

Bins will also be securely fastened to ensure that they do not move or open and release while underway.

Food waste that is likely to decompose (such as meat, prawn tails etc) will be double bagged and frozen ready to be disposed of at shore garbage facilities.

Food waste that has been ground or processed to be smaller than 25mm will not be discharged closer than 3nm from land. Food waste that has not been ground will not be discharged closer than 12nm from land.

Grease trap operation and level is to be monitored.

2. Processing garbage

The in- sink garbage disposal will not be used other than for food and not used closer than 3 NM from the shore. It will be maintained to the manufacturer's specifications.

All garbage will be disposed of using shore based facilities.

3. Storing and disposing of garbage

All passengers will be made aware of requirement to store garbage on board and not discharge overboard.

Bins will be available and their location pointed out to passengers.

Bins will also be securely fastened to make sure they do not move or open and release while at sea.

Depending on size and weight of the garbage, bins will either be wheeled or carried off the vessel making sure the bin liner is replaced as soon as the empty bin is returned to the vessel.

Food waste will be disposed of as soon as practicable.

All garbage will be disposed of using shore based facilities.

If shore based facilities are not available, adequate on board storage space will be allocated to make sure that garbage is appropriately managed until suitable shore based facilities are available
