



Asbestos removal, Endeavour Sports High School, Caringbah

Roads and Maritime Services | 17 July 2019

Roads and Maritime Services has been undertaking a carpark upgrade at Endeavour Sports High School on behalf of the Department of Education, as part of the Taren Point Road, The Boulevard and Captain Cook Drive intersection upgrade.

In the course of this work, asbestos and lead contamination was detected on site.

In accordance with workplace and public health procedures, the site has been secured and fenced off to prevent public or other unauthorised entry. The affected area is around 50 metres from the school's boundary on The Boulevard.

Removal of the material will begin on Thursday 18 July 2019, weather permitting. It is expected to take two or three days.

Our day work hours on this project are 7am to 6pm on weekdays and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays. Our night work hours are between 8pm and 5am, Sunday to Thursday.

School holidays are underway, so this part of our work won't affect regular school activities.

We have implemented an asbestos management plan that details safe work practices and ensures the removal is managed in accordance with strict Environment Protection Authority requirements.

The material will be removed safely by accredited contractors to best ensure there is no risk to the public. The material will be disposed of appropriately at a licenced waste management facility.
