

Cockatoo Island Wharf upgrade

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

November 2016

Construction would take about four to five months to complete.

The timing for work to upgrade the wharf would be advised when the planning process is complete. Construction would take about four to five months to complete, weather and maritime conditions permitting.

The standard work hours would be 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm Saturday.

Early morning or night work would be required for some activities including the installation of piles when the water is at its calmest. This

will generate noise. We would notify nearby residents and businesses prior to any early morning or night work taking place.

Equipment for the construction of the wharf would include barges, cranes and service boats. A temporary construction compound would be established on land near the wharf.

New structures including the gangway and pontoon will be prefabricated and transported to the site and installed.
