


## Night work at three intersections in Dubbo from Tuesday 6 July 2021

The Australian and NSW Governments are investing in a new bridge over the Macquarie River in Dubbo as part of their commitment to Building a better Dubbo. Once complete, the new bridge will ease congestion and maintain reliable access through Dubbo during flood events.



From **Tuesday 6 July 2021**, Transport for NSW will carry out utility investigation work at the following intersections in Dubbo:

- Bourke and River Street intersection
- Thompson Street and the Newell Highway intersection
- Thompson Street and Mitchell Highway intersection.

Transport for NSW will be carrying out utility investigation work which includes surveying and scanning utilities as part of the New Dubbo Bridge project (refer to map above for the location of the utility investigation work).

The work is expected to take four nights to complete, weather permitting.

Work hours will be between **7pm** and **7am** from **Tuesday 6 July** to **Friday 9 July 2021**.

## How will the work affect you?

The utility investigation work will take place on the road.

Access to businesses and residences will be maintained during this work.

## Traffic changes

Changed traffic conditions including reduced speed zones and temporary traffic control will be in place for the safety of workers and road users during work hours.

Motorists are advised to allow additional travel time, drive to the conditions and follow the directions of signs and traffic control.
