

Pedestrian access changes on Meninya Street from mid-April 2021

April 2021

Transport for NSW is carrying out work next to Meninya Street as part of the Moama intersection upgrades in Stage 4 of the Echuca Moama Bridge project. As part of this work, we will temporarily shift the existing pedestrian refuge about 100 metres south near Popplewell Street.

What are we doing?

The new intersections will serve as a key link to the new Echuca-Moama Bridge, providing better safety and efficiency for visitors, commuters and freight over the Murray River between Echuca and Moama.

Work includes:

- upgrading the Cobb Highway intersections with Perricoota Road and Meninya Street
- building a new intersection connecting the new bridge
- re-opening Francis Street
- installing traffic lights.

What you need to know

The temporary pedestrian refuge for crossing on Meninya Street will be in place until the new traffic lights are in operation. The intersection work in Moama Lions Park will involve the use of machinery which may generate some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise impacts. Additional changes to existing pedestrian access on Cobb Highway and Perricoota Road are planned in the future. We will notify you of those changes closer to the date and will continue to keep the community updated as the project progresses.

We will maintain access for pedestrians at all times but be aware you may have to walk around work zones and you may have to allow a little longer for your journey. Please keep to speed limits, keep out of work zones which are enclosed by fencing and safety barriers and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.
