# Public consultation report now online – proposed upgrade of Henry Lawson Drive at Georges Hall

Community update | February 2021



A Transport for NSW upgrade will reduce congestion and improve journey times on Henry Lawson Drive, at Georges Hall

Transport for NSW has published the results of public consultation on the proposed upgrade of Henry Lawson Drive, Georges Hall.

Transport for NSW will proceed with the upgrade, which will deliver an additional southbound lane between Haig Avenue and Rabaul Road, as well as prohibit right turns from Henry Lawson Drive onto Rabaul Road.

The changes will reduce southbound congestion by allowing more vehicles to clear the signalised Haig Avenue intersection. It will reduce northbound queuing caused by right turning vehicles at Rabaul Road.

In response to comments from members of the public and the local council, TfNSW will construct a new footpath on the eastern side of Henry Lawson Drive, between Haig Avenue and Rabaul Road.

Construction on the upgrade is on schedule to begin in 2021. We'll continue to update local residents and businesses as construction approaches and we continue to welcome enquiries and comments.
