

## Night work on Hexham Bridge, Hexham from Monday 26 April

Transport for NSW is continuing to carrying out essential maintenance work to ensure safe and reliable operation of the bridge.

Following the recent closure of Hexham Bridge, additional works were identified that are required to be completed. Transport will carry out the work, which includes servicing the deck and the lift span trusses.

We will be working between **8pm** and **5am** from **Monday to Thursday** and expect to complete the work in **two weeks**, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

### How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by completing noisier activities earlier in the night and turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

### Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

The southbound bridge will be closed during the work. All traffic will be diverted onto the northbound bridge, which will operate with one lane in each direction.

Closure of the pedestrian footpath will be required while the work is carried out. Traffic control will be on site to ensure safe escort for pedestrians across the bridge while the footpath is closed.

The opening span will not be in operation while the work carried out.
