

Night work on Swansea Bridge, Swansea, from Monday 31 October

The NSW Government is funding this essential biannual maintenance work to ensure the safe and reliable operation of the bridge.

Transport for NSW will carry out the work, which includes inspecting and testing the electrical, mechanical and hydraulic components and the emergency systems of the bridge. We will also be carrying out maintenance work to the bridge opening span deck, bridge locks and barriers.

We will be working on the southbound bridge between **7pm and 5am** from **Monday 31 October to Wednesday 2 November**, and expect to complete the work in **three nights**, weather permitting. We will be working on the northbound bridge between **7pm and 5am** on **Thursday 3 November**, and expect to complete the work in **one night**, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by completing noisier activities earlier in the night and turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe. One bridge will remain open at all times, operating with one lane in each direction while the maintenance work is being carried out.

Traffic control and a reduced speed limit of 40km/h will be in place for the safety of workers and motorists.

The bridge will not be open to marine traffic while the work is carried out.
