

## Night work on Swansea Bridges, Swansea from Monday 19 October

The NSW Government is funding biannual essential maintenance work to ensure the safe and reliable operation of the bridge.

Transport for NSW will carry out the work which includes inspecting and testing the electrical, mechanical and hydraulic components and the emergency systems of the bridges. We will also be carrying out maintenance work to the bridge deck joints, barriers and lift span.

We will be working between **7pm** and **5am** and expect to complete the work in **four nights**, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

### How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by completing noisier activities earlier in the night and turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

### Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

One bridge will remain open at all times while the maintenance work is being carried out, which will operate with one lane in each direction. **The southbound bridge will be closed at night on Monday 19 October and Tuesday 20 October. The northbound bridge will be closed at night on Wednesday 21 October and Thursday 22 October.**

The bridge will not be open to marine traffic at night while the work is carried out.
