

Vehicle activated sign installation on Oxley Highway, King Creek from Sunday 13 November

November 2022

The NSW Government is funding essential work on the Oxley Highway and King Creek Road intersection to improve safety and efficiency.

Transport for NSW will be installing two solar powered vehicle activated signs (VAS) to warn motorists travelling on the Oxley Highway of vehicle movements at the intersection of King Creek Road.

Radar posts will be installed at the King Creek Road intersection, these radars activate the signs when there are vehicle movements in the detection zone.

Work will start on Sunday 13 November and is expected to be completed by the end of November 2022, weather permitting.

Work will be carried out at night between **6.30pm** and **3.30am** from **Sunday to Thursday**. No work will be carried out on Fridays, Saturdays, or public holidays.

The stop line marking at the King Creek Road intersection will also be refreshed as part of this safety improvement work.



How does the VAS work?

VAS are digital roadside signs that display a message to approaching vehicles. The VAS will be installed about 100 metres from the King Creek Road intersection.

The VAS signs will display:

- **'TURNING VEHICLES'** when a vehicle is in the detection zone. The radar posts at the King Creek Road intersection activate the VAS, warning vehicles on the Oxley Highway of traffic movements at the intersection
- **'SLOW DOWN'** when vehicles approaching the King Creek Road intersection are exceeding the speed limit. The speed detection zones are about 50 metres from the VAS. The radars are not used for speed limit enforcement.

How will the work affect you?

Work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. Transport will make every effort to minimise noise by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use and positioning machinery away from residential areas where possible.

We will also limit the amount of machinery working together at any one time. Property access will be maintained at all times.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Traffic control and a reduced speed limit of 40km/h will be in place for the safety of workers and motorists, with stoppages of up to five minutes during work hours, which may affect travel times.

Work will be carried out at night to minimise impacts to motorists.

Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.
