Walking and cycling improvements: Kingsford to Centennial Park

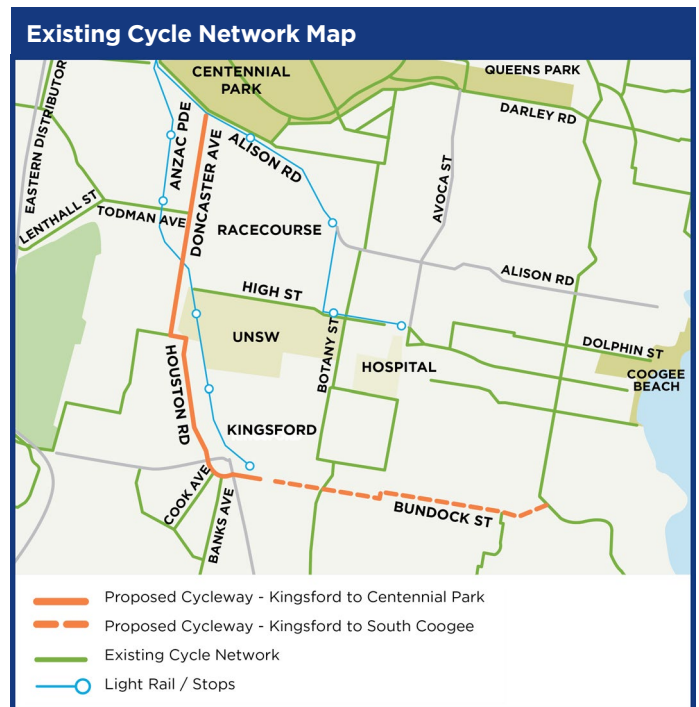
The Australian and NSW Governments are delivering walking and cycling improvements to provide an active transport link between Kingsford and Centennial Park.

In late November 2020, Transport for NSW will start the construction of a shared walking and bike riding path on Doncaster Avenue, between Alison Road and Abbotford Street, Kensington.

The shared path is early works for the soon to installed Doncaster Avenue stimulus funded cycleway. The new 2.8km bi-directional separated cycleway will run along Doncaster Avenue connecting the Kingsford Light Rail terminus to the Centennial Park cycleway at Alison Road, Randwick.

Stimulus Funding

This project is part of a \$240 million investment by Australian and State Governments to fast-track 11 congestion busting projects as part of the plan to stimulate the economy as it recovers from the COVID-19 pandemic.



Community consultation

In 2018, Randwick City Council consulted with the local community about a concept plan to improve walking and cycling between Kingsford and Centennial Park. More than 400 submissions were received on the plan with the majority (approximately 70 per cent) in support. The plan was updated to include the community feedback and was endorsed by Council at its meeting on **28 August 2018**.

What we are doing

The early work to take place on Doncaster Avenue, between Alison Road and Abbotford Street, Kensington, includes:

- Utility surveys
- Removal of existing footpaths, kerbs and gutters
- Concreting the new footpaths, kerbs and gutters
- Asphaltting and line marking

Key benefits

- Line marking to improve pedestrian and cyclist safety
- Easier to use and safer footpaths

Work schedule

We will be on-site up to **five nights a week** for **15 shifts**, from **late November** until the **end of January 2021**, weather permitting. We may work the occasional day shift. Our night work hours will be between **8pm** and **5am, Sunday to Thursday**. Our day work hours will be between **7am** and **6pm, Monday to Friday**, and **8am** to **1pm** on **Saturdays**. We will not work public holidays.

How will the work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times, but we will do everything we can to reduce the effect of the work, including completing the noisier activities such as concrete cutting and jack hammering by midnight.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours, which may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions. For the latest traffic updates, you can call **132 701**, visit livetraffic.com or download the **Live Traffic NSW App**.
