Night work southbound on the M1 Pacific Motorway from Sunday 22 March

The Australian and NSW governments are investing in the upgrade of the M1 Pacific Motorway between the Kariong and Somersby interchanges to improve traffic flow and safety.

Transport for NSW has awarded a contract to Fulton Hogan Construction to widen the motorway and upgrade three of the four ramps at the Kariong interchange.

Fulton Hogan will be carrying out concrete grinding along the motorway to preserve and improve the road surface. Concrete grinding involves the use of machinery to smooth out bumps in the concrete road surface.

Some work will be required outside of standard hours to ensure the safety of workers and motorists, and to minimise impacts to traffic. Concrete grinding at night will occur intermittently southbound along the motorway for three kilometres, from Peats Ridge Road to the Reeves Street overpass.

We will be working between **8pm** and **5am** from **Sunday** to **Friday** and expect to complete the work in three weeks, weather permitting.

How will the work affect you?

Nearby residents may experience some noise from the grinding machine, however it moves progressively along the pavement so the impact in particular areas will be for relatively short periods of time. Noise monitoring will be conducted during this work.

Dust will be minimised as the machine constantly sprays water as it is grinding. The run off will be captured during the work and stored in a tank where it will be taken off site for disposal.

We will make every effort to minimise the duration of noise impact to nearby residents by arranging the work in stages at different locations.

Traffic changes

A 40km/h speed limit will be in place around this night work area on the motorway. Traffic controllers and signage will be in place to safely direct motorists past the works.

The existing 80km/h speed limit will be in place during the day and on other sections of the motorway.
