Mascot intersection upgrades

Project update | September 2020



The newly constructed slip lane from Kent Road into Coward Street opened on 5 August 2020

Transport for NSW is upgrading five intersections in Mascot to meet future traffic demand in one of Sydney's busiest areas. The improvements will help reduce congestion, better manage heavy vehicle movements and improve safety. More detail on each of these projects is available online at rms.work/mascotintersections.

Completed work

We have recently completed four of the projects' five intersections. There may be minor defect and maintenance repairs at these intersections until the end of the project in **early 2021**.

- Bourke Street and Coward Street, Mascot
- Gardeners Road and Botany Road, Mascot
- Kent Road and Ricketty Street, Mascot
- Kent Road and Coward Street, Mascot

Stage 2 – Kent Road and Coward Street, Mascot

Work started on the intersection of Kent Road and Coward Street, Mascot on **Sunday 9 February 2020**. We completed this project on **5 August**, ahead of our original completion date of **early 2021**.

A large part of the work was the relocation of gas, water, telecommunications and electrical utilities. The work also involved constructing a new slip lane for vehicles turning left from Kent Road into Coward Street, as well as new pedestrian crossings and traffic island. This aims to improve safety and reduce the risk of collisions at this busy intersection.

Stage 3 – Gardeners Road and O’Riordan Street, Mascot

From **Monday 14 September**, work will begin at the intersection of Gardeners Road and O’Riordan Street, Mascot. We will be installing new signs, resurfacing sections of the road, establishing new line markings and adjusting the phasing of the traffic light signals at the intersection. When work is complete, right-turns will be no longer allowed from Gardeners Road into O’Riordan Street. Left-turns for vehicles over 12.5m will be no longer allowed from Gardeners Road into O’Riordan Street.

To make these changes, we will be on site up to five nights a week for up to **15 shifts**, from **Monday 14 September** until **Monday 30 November 2020**. Our work hours will be from **7pm to 6am, Sunday to Friday**.

How will the work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times, but we will do everything we can to reduce this, including completing the noisier activities such as concrete cutting, chainsawing and jack hammering, by midnight.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours, which may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers’ directions. For the latest traffic updates, you can call **132 701**, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW App.
