Milton Ulladulla bypass | November 2020

A preferred strategic corridor option has been announced

Transport for NSW is progressing with plans for a Milton Ulladulla bypass. The existing bypass corridor in the Shoalhaven Local Environmental Plan (LEP) has been identified as the preferred strategic corridor option.

A preferred strategic corridor option report can be viewed online at nswroads.work/miltonulladullabypass or at Ulladulla Library, Princes Highway, Ulladulla.

Why was this option chosen?

Transport for NSW and a range of technical specialists from local, NSW and Federal Government agencies considered the existing bypass corridor in the Shoalhaven LEP against a range of alternative bypass corridor options, including bypass corridors located further west and extending further south of the LEP corridor.

The preferred strategic corridor was recommended as it was considered to best achieve the objectives of the project and Princes Highway upgrade program.

Further work is planned to understand the future needs and performance of the Princes Highway south of the preferred strategic corridor. This will include consideration of improvements as part of the Burrill Lake to Batemans Bay upgrade project.




