# Moruya bypass | Preferred Strategic Bypass Corridor

## The preferred strategic bypass corridor for Moruya has been identified

Transport for NSW is progressing with a bypass of Moruya and has identified a preferred strategic bypass corridor. This corridor will be used to develop design options for the bypass in the next phase of the project.

The bypass would reduce congestion, improve connectivity, transport efficiency and safety for passing motorists and local transport users including motorists, pedestrians and cyclists. The bypass would also provide access to the new Eurobodalla Health Service.

## Why was this option chosen?

The preferred strategic bypass corridor has been identified following a review of earlier community feedback and consideration of multiple strategic options.


These options were assessed against the project objectives in technical workshops involving key stakeholders.

Benefits of the identified corridor include:

- Safer journeys for everyone, including those using the bypass and Moruya town centre
- Reduced congestion and fewer heavy vehicles in Moruya town centre
- Improved flood resilience of the highway
- Better access to the proposed Eurobodalla Health Service and Moruya TAFE
- Caters for future growth of the town and opportunities to improve public transport, pedestrian and cyclist networks.

## Preferred Strategic Corridor




## Benefits of the proposed Moruya bypass

-  Reduce travel time and congestion particularly in peak periods, by removing the need for vehicles to pass through numerous intersections
-  Improve safety by taking trucks off local roads
-  Improve flood resilience of the Princes Highway
-  Enable more efficient movement of freight
-  Enhance the amenity and liveability of the Moruya town centre for locals, visitors and businesses
-  Cater for future growth of the town and provide ease of access to employment and essential services such as health care and education

Following consultation on the preferred strategic bypass corridor, Transport will develop a preferred design option. The preferred design option will have more information on the location of the bypass and proposed connections to the existing road network.

Before finalising the preferred bypass design option, the project team will:

- Consider and respond to all community feedback provided on the preferred strategic bypass corridor.
- Carry out more investigations to better understand the geotechnical, flooding and environmental constraints and Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal heritage impacts.
- Design bypass connections to get on and off the bypass.

There will be further opportunities for the community to have their say.
