

Mosman Bay ferry wharf upgrade

Overview

The NSW Government is upgrading the Mosman Bay ferry wharf.

The new wharf is being delivered as part of the NSW Government's \$770 million Transport Access Program – an initiative to deliver modern, safe and accessible transport infrastructure where it is most needed. The Transport Access Program has already delivered new facilities at Milsons Point, Neutral Bay, Rose Bay, Balmain (Thames Street) and Huntleys Point.

Much of the existing Mosman Bay wharf structure will be retained and refurbished.

The upgraded wharf will provide:

- Better protection from the wind, rain and sun
- Improved safety for passengers
- Improved access for mobility impaired passengers and passengers with prams
- Quicker and more efficient boarding and disembarking.

Work is expected to start in the first quarter of 2014 and will take about six months to complete, weather and maritime conditions permitting. The existing wharf will be temporarily closed and no ferry services will operate to the wharf during the upgrade.

All efforts will be made by the project team to reopen the wharf as soon as possible.
