

Work on the New England Highway at Nemingha from Monday 7 February

The NSW Government is funding major work on the New England Highway from just north of Nundle Road to just south of Wollanda Road to provide a safer journey for all road users.

Transport for NSW will carry out this important work, which involves resurfacing the road, improving drainage, maintaining vegetation including trimming of overhead tree branches, shoulder widening and installing new line marking and roadside safety barriers.

We will be working between **7am and 6pm from Monday to Saturday, from Monday 7 February**. Work is expected to be completed by mid-2022, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

How will the work affect you?

Work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise and no work will take place outside work hours.

Access to properties will be maintained at all times. If this should change, residents will be notified.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Traffic will be reduced to a one lane alternate flow during work hours. Motorists should allow up to five minutes extra travel time during this work.

Normal traffic arrangements will be in place outside work hours. At times, a reduced speed limit of 60km/h or 40km/h will be in place outside of work hours for the safety of workers and road users.
