Continuing work on New England Highway upgrade at Kootingal

Transport for NSW is delivering important safety improvements on the New England Highway, between Sandy and Braefarm roads at Kootingal.

This work is funded through a \$50 million allocation from the NSW Government's Saving Lives on Country Roads program for projects between Uralla and Willow Tree.

Most of the construction activities at Kootingal are complete, with intersection improvements carried out at Privet, Oak, Pine, Laurel, Gill, Wilson and Chelmsford streets and at the intersection of Dorothy Avenue and the New England Highway. The primer seal and temporary line markings were also completed in July 2021.

Transport for NSW will carry out the remaining works, which include the final seal, new line marking and installation of signage. We have included a map to show the location of the work below.

We will be working **Monday to Saturday** between **7am** and **6pm** from **Wednesday 16 February** and expect to complete the project within **four weeks**, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Lane closures and a 40km/h speed limit will be in place during work hours and may affect travel times. Motorists should allow up to five minutes extra travel time during this work.
