

Night work on the Pacific Highway duplication at Lisarow in August / September

The NSW Government is investing \$178 million to duplicate the Pacific Highway between Ourimbah Street and Parsons Road, Lisarow to improve traffic flow and safety.

We are working between 7am and 6pm on weekdays and 8am and 1pm on Saturdays. Some out of hours work is required for the safety of motorists and workers and to ensure work on the project is carried out as efficiently as possible.

There will be five nights of work between **Monday 31 August** and **18 September** between **6pm and 7am**.

Night work will include:

- asphaltting the new alignment of Railway Crescent near the “Bakery Estate” and near the intersection of Railway Crescent and the Pacific Highway
- realignment activities to move vehicles on to the new section of Railway Crescent
- connecting utility services on Railway Crescent, across property accesses on Railway Crescent and on the highway near the northern compound
- accessing site compounds on Railway Crescent, Macdonalds Road and the northern compounds on the Pacific Highway.

We have included a map to show the location and type of work in each area.

Work completed

- Nearly 70 per cent of utility relocation work has been completed. This includes water, sewer, gas, NBN, Telstra, Nextgen and electrical services, which has required more than six kilometres of trenching
- About 50 per cent of piling for the foundations for the new rail bridge and supporting structures has been completed
- Ground improvement work to support the new road and bridge approach was completed in January 2020. This involved drilling and mixing more than 500 holes to a depth of 20 metres with more than 4,700 million litres of grout.
- Other work underway includes earthworks for the new road, installation of stormwater drainage culverts and building of retaining walls near Lisarow cemetery and The Ridgeway.

Upcoming work

Key building activities planned for the next three months include:

- Continue utilities and service relocations
- Continue building the bridge piers and abutments at the rail bridge

- Continue building the retaining walls on the Pacific Highway
- Continue building the new alignment of Tuggerah Street
- Continue earthwork for widening of The Ridgeway.

How will work affect you?

The night work will involve the use of machinery which generates noise.

We will make every effort to minimise noise by completing noisier activities earlier in the night and turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use. Noise blankets will also be used around stationary plant, where possible.

Directly affected residents will be contacted and advised of the likely impact and what we are doing to minimise disruption during the work.

Traffic changes

Traffic on Railway Crescent will be realigned onto a section of new road. VMS boards will also be in place to notify motorists of these changes.


Lane closures and traffic control will be in place during the work and may affect travel times. There may be short term intermittent stops and a temporary 40 km/h reduced speed limit will be in place through the work zones for the safety of motorists and workers.
