



Improvements to Stacey Street & Fairford Road, Bankstown

Project update

Transport for NSW | February 2021

Construction is continuing on the widening of Stacey Street northbound to provide an additional lane between Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street and upgrade the intersections of Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street.

Project benefits

- Reduced congestion on Stacey Street and Fairford Road by providing additional north and south bound lanes on Stacey Street.
- Traffic flow will be improved onto Stanley Street from Stacey Street south bound by extending the right turning bay.
- Upgrade to intersection of Macauley Avenue and Fairford Road.
- Installing dual right turning lanes and a dedicated bus lane onto Fairford Road, making it easier to access from Macauley Avenue.

Work to date

- Construction of retaining wall and capping beam along Stacey Street northbound.
- Storm water upgrade between Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street.
- Widening of the roadway between Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street.

What's happening next

- New kerb and gutter between Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street.
- Continuing construction of 3rd lane road widening between Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street intersections
- Upgrade to intersection of Macauley Avenue and Fairford Road.

- Installation of an additional right turning lane and a separate bus lane onto Fairford Road from Macauley Avenue.
- Completion of traffic signals at Stanley Street and Macauley Avenue and upgrade to pedestrian signal crossings at Macauley Avenue and new pedestrian crossing at Salvia Avenue.

Our work schedule

We will be onsite for up to **25 night shifts** from **3 February** to **31 March 2021** weather permitting. Our night shift hours will be between **8pm** and **5am** from **Sunday** to **Thursday**.

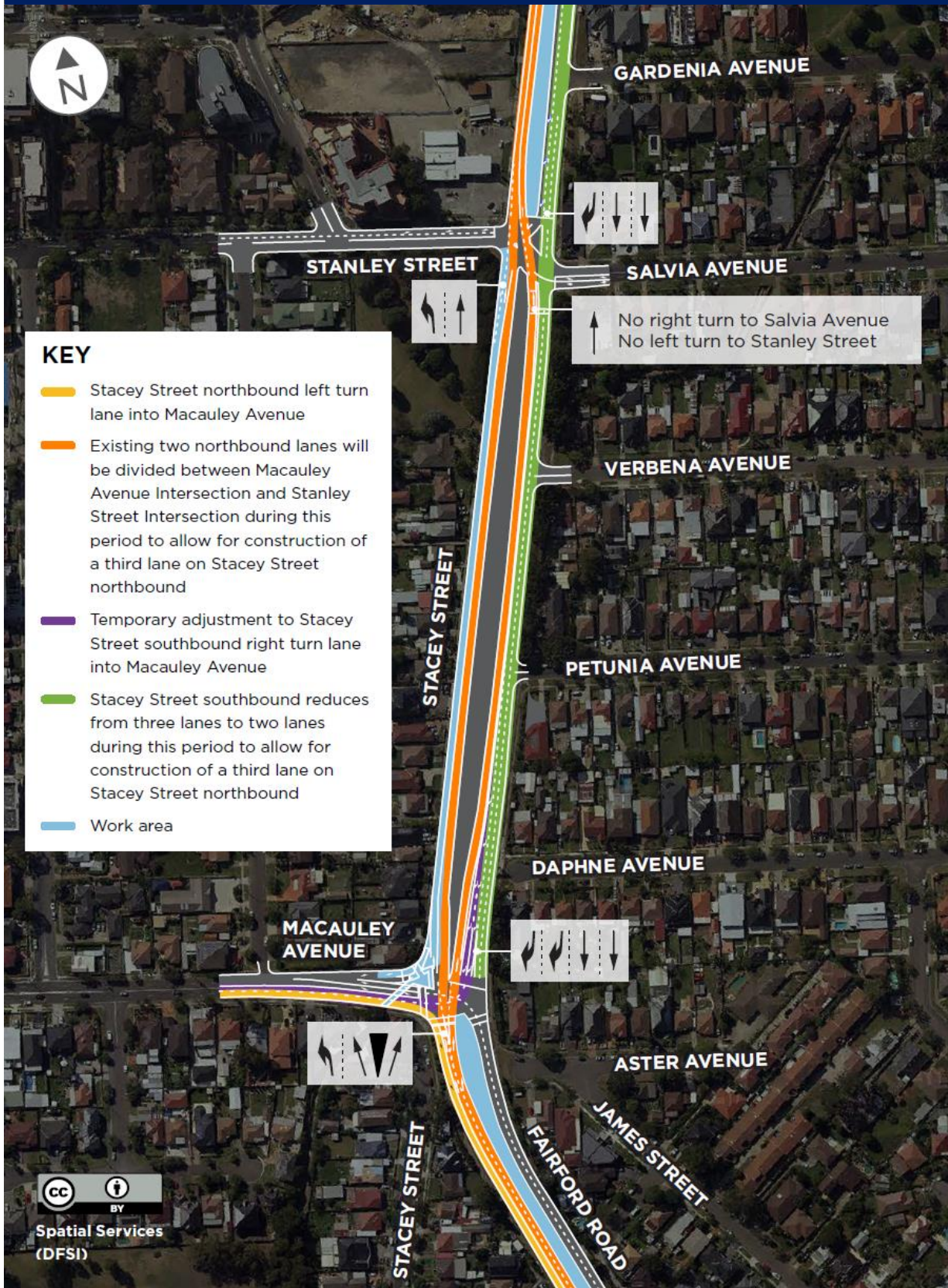
Our day shift hours are between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday** to **Friday**. We will work between **8am** and **5pm** on **Saturdays**.

Our work may be noisy at times but we will do everything we can to minimise its impact, including implementing noise mitigation measures and completing the noisier activities such as concrete cutting, and jack hammering by **midnight**.
